COURSE CONTENT

The course on Public Policy Mediation consists of 40 hours of training in the following areas: mediation theory, public policy mediation, law, ethics, litigation, multi-party disputes, and interpersonal communication skills and dynamics. Participants will practice mediation skills with proven, hands-on activities, including supervised role-playing, small group exercises, and an interactive video program developed by the Harvard Law School Program on Negotiation.

In addition to earning 24 hours of CLE credit, course participants will earn 40 hours of basic civil mediation training that will qualify them to become registered civil mediators under Ind. A.D.R. Rule 2.5. Approval has been granted by the Indiana Commission on Continuing Legal Education qualifying the 40-hour training for Supreme Court certification.

The course, which is applicable to dispute resolution and problem solving in a variety of settings, offers participants the most affordable civil mediation training available in central Indiana.

FACULTY

John Krauss, an experienced mediator, attorney and educator qualified to conduct basic mediation training under the Indiana Supreme Court Rules, will be the primary trainer for the course.

Nan Stager, who serves as co-trainer, is an experienced mediator and has taught Alternative Dispute Resolution at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Additionally, throughout the week guest speakers will include seasoned practitioners, litigators, judges and experts in their fields of mediation, government and public policy.
